



FACT SHEET FOR APRIL 2008

ALL LANGALANGA SCHOLARS

- 80 Scholars are supported at Secondary School;
- 64 Scholars are supported in the tertiary phase;
- 1 Scholar has completed tertiary education;
- 4 Scholars supported only in their gap year;
- 1 Scholar has left Primary School for Disabled;
- 3 Scholars have had their Scholarships removed;
- 1 Scholar failed to graduate.

SPONSORS AND FUNDING

- **Secondary Education at 2008**
 - 151 Scholars will be or have been fully funded by their sponsor;
 - 2 Scholars were funded by LLSF in the first year only as their Scholarships were withdrawn;
 - 1 Scholar has been mainly funded by LLSF.
- **Tertiary education at 2008**
 - 1 Scholar has graduated and was fully funded by her sponsor;
 - 25 Scholars are already fully funded by their sponsors;
 - 24 Scholars are expected to be fully funded by their sponsors;
 - 16 Scholars are expected to be part funded by sponsors and part by LLSF funds;
 - 75 Scholars need further support from their sponsor otherwise funding will be required from LLSF tertiary funds;
 - 3 Scholars are expected to be entirely funded using LLSF funds;
 - 10 Scholars are no longer supported through tertiary.

TREATMENT OF DONATIONS

- Donations – 100% of all donations goes directly to the benefit of the Langalanga Scholars.

ADMINISTRATION

- Cost of Administration – All administration costs involved with running LLSF are met from interest receipts on total capital.

SECONDARY SCHOLARSHIPS

- 1999 to 2006 - The value of an LLSF Scholarship amounted to £400 per year;
- 2007 onwards – The value of an LLSF Scholarship increased to £450 per year.

GAP YEAR

- Successful Scholars apply for tertiary courses and have some 5 months to wait for college, or 18 months for university, before taking their places.
- During this period Scholars are expected to attend a 90 hour computer module course, obtain an email address, open a bank account, buy a mobile phone, obtain a national ID card, and teach at a primary school. The latter enables them to give something back to the community;
- LLSF pays assistant teachers' salaries giving Scholars independence for the first time in their lives;

TERTIARY EDUCATION

- There is great variation in yearly costs dependent on place of learning, course and whether first, intermediate or final years. These range from circa £900 to £2,400 with the current average being circa £1,350.
